Support Service update

While a lot of our work seems to have been around the NDIS and My Aged Care space I thought it would be good to let you know that we are also working closely with groups such as the <u>Consumers Health</u> <u>Forum of Australia</u> (CHF) and <u>Genetic Alliance Australia</u> to more broadly achieve better access to health services as well. To that end, we are now part of a special interest group for regional and remote health consumers through CHF. This group is currently gathering information about the health service challenges people living in rural and remote areas are experiencing. I would be very interested in hearing your stories and sharing them with this group to strengthen the voice of people living with MND in the discussions CHF are having with policy and decision makers. We have had a great response to my recent 'call out' to our members about their experiences with the My Aged Care system. We really appreciate your responses and it has been interesting to see the common themes emerging. As expected there are some long waiting times for packages being reported, although some members have secured a package at the level they needed within three to six months of their application. Sadly though, there are still a lot of people waiting for two years or more, so the fight will continue to get this system working the way our members need it to.

A very big thank you to our 'online education' member testers who volunteered their time to help us test our new online education system. With their help we have now been able to iron out some issues and to better understand the information participants need from us so they can access the platform with ease. Our first online Chat and Connect sessions will be held on Wednesday 18 September 2019. For more information see page 4 of this edition of *e-news*.

ALS Untangled - more than 50 completed investigations

ALS Untangled is an international network of physicians and researchers investigating alternative and off-label treatments for ALS/MND. People with motor neurone disease (known as amyotrophic lateral sclerosis or ALS in some parts of the world) often consider alternative treatments, based on information gleaned from the internet. These can be expensive and some are potentially harmful.



Moreover, the evidence presented for the efficacy and safety of these treatments is often sketchy and frequently inaccurate.

ALS Untangled investigates these alternative treatments. Goals for each investigation are to clarify exactly what is on offer, how much it costs, the scientific and ethical basis of the treatment, and the potential benefits and risks. More than 50 investigations have now been completed. ALS Untangled reports provide timely, accurate and scientifically valid analysis of alternative treatments. They are prepared by clinical scientists who are members of the World Federation of Neurology Research Group on MND or the International ALS Research Group. 

ALS Quest - get involved and complete the questionnaire

You are invited to participate in an ongoing research project that is looking for risk factors that might contribute to the development of motor neurone disease (MND). An online anonymous questionnaire asks a series of questions that may provide clues as to what factors trigger MND in some people. Anyone is welcome to complete the questionnaire - people with a sporadic or familial form of MND, their



relatives and also people without MND in order to compare lifestyle factors. This questionnaire can be completed regardless of geographical location, so please share with any friends or family who may live overseas who would be happy to contribute.

The questionnaire, designed by Dr Roger Pamphlett at the University of Sydney, and instructions for how to complete it can be found at <u>www.alsquest.org.</u> This study has been approved by the Ethics Review Committee (RPAH Zone) of the Sydney Local Health District. Please note, if you have previously submitted a response to the ALS Quest questionnaire, there is no need to complete it again. Wrapping up Ask the Experts 2019

Our Ask the Experts Forum in August was a great success, with an impressive line-up of three experts in their fields.

Associate Professor Roger Pamphlett of the Brain and Mind Centre has spent thirty years dedicated to MND research. He provided a most interesting overview of MND. Roger also spoke about the results to date from the ALS Quest research exploring genetics, epigenetics, lifestyle and environmental triggers, toxins, life events and aging.

Professor Colleen Cartwright is Emeritus Professor and Chair of the

Human Research Ethics Committee of Southern Cross University and Principal Director of Cartwright Consulting Australia. Colleen provided an engaging and thought-provoking talk about the ways that a person can maintain control and peace of mind about their future health care by completing an

Advanced Care Directive. We learnt about the practical and legal benefits of appointing substitute decision makers to make future financial, personal, medical or lifestyle decisions on behalf of another who has lost capacity to do this for themselves.

Associate Professor Megan Munsie is Deputy Director of the University

of Melbourne's Centre for Stem Cell Systems where she leads a research program in the ethical, legal and social implications of stem cell research. She also heads the Engagement, Ethics and Policy Unit of the Australian Government funded Stem Cells Australia initiative. As a trained developmental

biologist, Megan's talk drew upon her scientific expertise along with her deep understanding of the ethical and regulatory considerations required to facilitate responsible research in stem cell science. She spoke about the importance of clinical trials and maintaining hope, whilst also challenging the hype of social media marketing of unproven and often risky therapies. It was encouraging to learn that Australia is a leader in stem cell research.

Link and Learn

7-8 November in the Hunter Valley

Are you a family member, relative or friend caring for someone with MND? If you are keen to gain some extra information and support, this program may be ideal for you. It is suitable for those new to the caring role and also those who have been caring for some time.



The program, called <u>`Link and Learn'</u>, is residential and runs over two days and a night in the beautiful Hunter Valley on Thursday 7 and Friday 8 November 2019.

You will have the opportunity to hear from a range of health professionals and MND NSW staff with expertise in MND, who will answer your questions and facilitate discussion in a relaxed and informal setting.

The aim of 'Link and Learn' is to support you to give the best possible care at home for the person with MND by:

- reducing the sense of isolation associated with becoming a carer through meeting other carers and sharing ideas and experiences
- providing you with information so that you can be prepared and able to plan ahead for the changes that may occur. This will help you, and the person you are caring for, to maintain a sense of control over these changes
- letting you know how to find support services and how to care for yourself so that you can carry on caring.

Those who have attended this program previously tell us that they especially valued the opportunity to take time out for themselves and to share their ideas and experiences with others in similar situations. As one person said, "this program is a very valuable insight for anyone in a carers role with plenty of learning, laughter and knowledge gained".

Participation in the program, including meals and accommodation, is free of charge for people caring for someone with MND, but we do ask that you commit to attending the two days. Dying to Know Day

Dying to Know Day (D2KDay) is an annual day of action dedicated to bringing to life conversations and community actions around death, dying and bereavement. D2KDay was launched in 2013, by the Groundswell Project and has been embraced across NSW. In 2019, Dying to Know Day was on 8 August.

The Northern Beaches Hospital, in partnership with

the Sydney North Primary Health Network and HammondCare hosted an Advance Care Planning (ACP) forum to mark D2KDay this year. Our Education and Carer support coordinators were invited to attend and set up an information table about MND NSW with fact sheets, booklets and a few puppies in tow. It was a full house with over 150 attendees.

Dr Peter Saul, Senior Specialist in Intensive Care at John Hunter Hospital spoke about how advance care directives have not only legal authority, but also provide a framework for discussion and a way of documenting preferences when substitute decision makers may be unsure or disagree. GP Stephen Ginsborg spoke of his work in Compassionate Communities, an international movement that aims to build community capacity to support people approaching the end of their lives. Colleen Carter, from the NSW Ambulance service who shared the <u>NSW Ambulance Authorised Adult Palliative Care Plan</u> (APCP) that enables paramedics to provide individualised care to a patient with life limiting illness.
